I had a 1963 VW Beetle so was familiar with engines being in the back. But the 911 was out of my reach and I ended up with a 1970 Triumph GT-6. Not a real rocket at 90 bhp, but that car quickly morphed into a new 1974 Triumph TR-6 and at 106 bhp. Still it was not a 911 but marginally closer. Enjoyed going to Laguna Seca during that time and even enjoyed being quickly passed by 911's on their way down to the races. Watching the IMSA races and watching Porsche, BMW, Jaguar, Ford and Chevrolet duke it out on that little track was pure heaven. Seeing Richard Petty, Paul Newman and a host of other drivers in the paddock (remember in those days, no special passes, you just waited for the race to end and two course workers would let you walk across the track). Getting up close to those wonderful creations and seeing the engineering and horsepower was fascinating and educational. Fast forward to 2009 and a 2007 Carrera in Seal Grey found its way into my garage. That car became a 2008 Carrera S a year later and two years later that became a 2007 911 GT3. I called my brother-in-law in North Carolina, a fellow Porsche fan (1992 C2). He mentioned that he was a PCA member and started forwarding his local region newsletter called Tobacco Roads to read. Subsequent emails and phone calls he suggested I join PCA. In November 2009 we joined PCA and SVR.

That started it all for Rebecca and me. After we joined, we got a copy of PCA's magazine, Panorama, a welcome letter from SVR, and a copy of the Drifter. In 2010 we read the emails from SVR and copies of the Drifter started showing up in our mailbox (yes, mailed!). We attended a dinner at Orchid Thai restau-

rant hosted by **Bob and Beth Jacobson**. Everyone was so nice and offered to share a table with us "newbies". I attended the new member tour to Thunderhill that year and we got to drive our cars (at 35mph) on the track! Me, in a Porsche on a track (yeah, that 35 mph is still there) was fun. I was approached by the tour leader Lee Deter and he asked me to write an article for the Drifter about my experience at Thunderhill. I said yes right away giving details about the day at the track and how the SVR members were so helpful and friendly. That was followed by several dinners, and then came Mendocino, our first multi-day tour with SVR.

At the Saturday dinner on the Mendocino tour, we were sitting with Mike and Emily Willis, he mentioned that the next multi-day tour was San Simeon and was wondering if we would assist him. Well, I said yes! We worked as a team and the tour was a great success. Rebecca and I have volunteered at various events and hosted dinners. of dollars in tools of the trade to have the right instrument/tool for a given application.





# Using Your Porsche's Brakes By Skip Quain, with contributions from Nick Lettini, Ron Kain & Collin Fat Photo Porsche

On a Club tour this year I noticed a driver ahead of me was at times going into corners with NO brake lights showing. When we had a rest stop I queried him "Why No Brakes lights at several corners" His response was 'I'm saving my brakes by using engine compression to slow for the corners. In speaking with other members on this topic I found this belief very common.

However, my experience in racing over the past several decades, at the major tracks on the West Coast such as Laguna Seca, Sears Point, Thunderhill, Portland, and the famous Riverside Raceway, has proven saving your brakes is not a valid racing technique.

I decided to research the technique of using engine compression instead of using your brakes to slow our Porsche going into a corner. My first step was to contact several of the Drifter's advertisers and ask their opinion of using engine compression to slow your Porsche. I contacted Ron Kain at IPB and Nick at Frank's Automotive, both in Sacramen-

slow your Porsche's momentum going into a corner, you are using your engine as a compressor. The Porsche motor is not designed for this function and you are putting undue stress on the motor.

If using the motor's compression to slow your momentum and you miss a downshift your rev limiter will NOT keep you from over-revving.

The bottom line is: When you use your Porsche motor to slow for a corner rather than your braking system you are risking your \$20,000 Porsche motor vs your \$800 Porsche Brake system — a bad trade-off.

In addition, when entering a corner at too high a speed using only engine compression to slow your speed you may suddenly find your speed too excessive and you are required to fully apply the brakes to bring down the speed. This action could "unsettle" the car which could cause you problems maintaining your line.

The newer Porsche models have ABS/Traction Control. These features

Porsche's newer PDK transmissions are amazing and offer not only rev matching on a downshift but will automatically down shift for you when entering a turn. Yes, this is engine braking but is done automatically in conjunction with braking.

to. I also contacted our own Collin Fat for his AutoX experience. The response from all was:

The Porsche's we drive have excellent brakes and the driving we do on tours will not stress the brakes to the point that would damage the pads or rotors.

When using engine compression to

allow the driver to go harder into a corner apply the brakes and steer into the corner all at the the same time.

Over the years the Porsche's braking system has improved to the point that only serious competition on a high-speed track such as running several laps at the Nordschleife at speeds of 210 kph+, could cause you braking issues.





## **Along Comes a Spyder**

My friends at Niello Porsche called in March of 2015 and asked if I was interested in ordering a 2016 Spyder. Having read some of the buzz about the car. I hesitated long enough to mumble some form of confirmation and I was on my way. Ordering the car was a breeze, not unlike ordering a pizza when you haven't eaten after a day of skiing or hiking: "extra-large?" Of course. Deep dish with extra pepperoni and olives would be good and so on. And so, my Spyder ended up with PCCB brakes, sport seats, extended alcantara interior, leather steering wheel, body colored roll bars and a plethora of other Porsche options. Somehow, I missed the order boxes for a metal gas cap and leather wrapped sun visors. I know what you're thinking: how can you do without leather on the sun visors? Just foolish I guess.

Delivery day: wrapped in white plastic, I was at the Dealership when they unloaded my car. The drive home was memorable. Loud (no insulation in the top), seats that I have since learned how to roll out of (I generally only buy gas at night so as to avoid betraying my age) and handling and braking that Porsche media claims is "unfiltered".

An exceptionally well-fed racoon's poorly timed decision to cross resulted in a near miss. Stabbing the brakes, the transmission dropped from seventh to fourth instantly. My car was unblemished, the racoon lived and shortly, I was able to pull my eye lids back over my eyes.

#### "Eleanor"

Everyone under that age of 30 knows the 1967 Shelby GT 500 as an "Eleanor". Thank you, Nicholas Cage, and "Gone in Sixty Seconds".

I was 10 years old when my folks bought a small vacation home at South Lake Tahoe. Carroll Shelby owned a dealership at the "Y" at South Lake Tahoe. I frequented that dealership every time we went to the Lake. The passion burned for over 40 years quelled only when I bought a 1967 sky blue Shelby GT 500". This acquisition was unique and will likely never be repeated. I was the winner of an internet based auction. My bid was casually entered without a thought that I might actually be the high bidder. And thus began the multi-year saga of restoring the car.

Nose heavy with drum brakes on the back, enthusiastic braking will reward the unwary with a sudden maneuver reminiscent of lift throttle oversteer that early 911 owners are familiar with.

### **Plastic Fantastic**

The 80's were dark days for us aficionados. Emission controls had succeeded where the insurance companies had not. Performance, with few exceptions, was a fond memory. As proof, I present the 1980 Corvette which was offered in California only with a 5-liter, 180 horsepower automatic. Fast forward 35 years to 2015 and the Corvette can be had with a 650-horsepower supercharged V8 and a seven-speed manual (or eight-speed automatic) called the "Z06".

The Vette is great fun and profoundly different from the Porsche experience. Black with a black interior and seven-speed, I've not gotten to know it well as it is a recent acquisition. Somehow, when ever I go out to drive the car, the dark vibe of Darth Vader's musical introduction starts playing in the back of my mind. The car provides an interesting contrast to the approach to performance that Porsche has taken with the 911. With the engine in front and transmission in the rear, the Corvette's weight distribution is exactly the opposite of the mid-engine Sypder.

Regardless of your automotive affections, the automotive world would be a lot less entertaining without the 911 or the Corvette.

Like Porsche and the Corvette, Harleys have evolved and become more sophisticated and more compatible with the array of regulations facing any modern vehicle. # Guidelines for submission of material to the Drifter



Articles

Please submit articles as a Microsoft Word document or in plain text format. While we can accept PDF files, it adds extra steps for the editors to get the material out for for editing. <u>Most articles should run about 2 to 3 pages of single spaced text.</u> We will reformat and edit your article anyway, no matter how pretty it looks, so please send it in correctly the first time.

**Event flyers** 

We can accept either Word or PDF formats, but Word is preferred. Space limitations in the Drifter currently limit event flyers to  $\frac{1}{2}$  page; full page flyers will automatically be re-formatted into a  $\frac{1}{2}$  page size. Don't fret over creating a "killer design" event flyer; just send us the basic details and we will do the rest.

**Photographs** 

Photographs add significant quality and interest to most articles. We would like to have a number of your photographs to accompany your articles, although space limitations and editorial decisions may not permit all of them to be published. Whenever possible, the photographer who took the picture will be credited when the information is available. For any photograph submitted to the Drifter, it must be in the largest size (with the most pixels) possible! This means the actual size as it comes off your camera, computer, phone, iPad or whatever. If you email it to us from your computer or phone, use "actual size" for emailing, not photos which have been resized for quick email transmission. Photographs taken off of a website generally won't work for our print publication because of their small size. If you send photographs on a CD, save the save them in the largest size possible. JPEG, TIFF or Photoshop (PSD) formats are all OK

Embedded photos in Microsoft Word are fine to accompany your articles, as long as you send us the "full size" versions as well. Sorry, but we can't accept a Word file with only embedded photos in the text.

We would like to use photographs on the entire cover page whenever possible. Photographs taken in the "portrait mode" lend themselves to a full cover shot better than other formats. if you would like us to consider your photograph for the cover of the Drifter, please consider taking it in "portrait mode" as opposed to the more common "landscape mode". Again, the photographs must be sent in the largest version possible to give a proper size image for the cover.
