Is Porsche thinking about an F1 entry?

That's the rumor. According to DTM boss and F1 legend Gerhard Berger, Porsche is considering entering Formula 1 in 2021. Recently, video footage of Porsche's successful attempt to unofficially break the F1 circuit record at Belgium's Spa racetrack has emerged with a modified LMP car. According to multiple sources, Porsche AG is just waiting for the new F1 engine regulations (which should be released this month), and then they'll decide. Liberty Media, who owns F1 says the sport would welcome Porsche to the grid and claim they are creating the environment for it.

Porsche 911 GT3 RS dominates the Nürburgring with sub-7-minute lap. We all know Porsche loves the Nürburgring Nordschleife, but if there's one thing Porsche loves even more, it's setting or breaking track records. It's only the third production Porsche to break the 7-minute mark. Along with the aforementioned 918, the only other member of the sub-7 club is the also-new GT2 RS. That 700-horsepower monster clocked a time of 6:47.03, beating such

cars as the Lamborghini Huracan Performante and Radical SR8 LM. The 2019 Porsche 911 GT3 RS (991.2) has more power and better handling than ever before. Porsche reserved a track day and took it to "The 'Ring" to see how fast it could run a lap. The result was a 6:56.40. That's 24 seconds faster than the current 991 GT3 RS. It also happens to be about 1 second faster than the 918 Spyder hyper-car. The record lap was accomplished wearing Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2 R tires. These tires will be available at any Porsche dealer. This 2019 GT3 RS puts out 520 horsepower from a naturally aspirated, 4.0-liter flat-six. It'll hit 60 mph in 3.0 seconds. In addition to more horsepower, this 991.2 version has improved aerodynamics, tweaks to its suspension and a lower curb weight. The 40 lb reduction in weight is due to the optional Weissach Package. The new 2019 911 GT3 RS is available to order now and is expected to reach U.S. dealers in fall 2018. The MSRP is \$187,500, not including dealer mark-up, available options, \$1,050 delivery, taxes, processing and handling fees. With this package, the front and rear sway bars and coupling rods,

vehicle roof, steering wheel trim, and shift paddles on the steering wheel are all made of carbon fiber, reducing the weight by roughly 13 pounds. Optional forged magnesium wheels, weighing around 25 pounds less than the standard wheels, are available as well in conjunction with the Weissach package. When equipped with these options, the weight of the 911 GT3 RS drops to 3,153 pounds. The full Weissach Package is available for an additional \$30,000 but that cost can be roughly cut in half if you don't get the magnesium wheels.. Ka-Ching!

Porsche and Formula E




Are you afraid that auto-crossing will "hurt" your car? Well, don't be. Over the course of an autocross event, the total mileage you will drive your car is *five* miles. Your tires, frame and suspension can certainly handle it. If you hit a cone or two, it takes seconds to clean off the scuff it may leave on your car.

Do you want to become a better driver? Who doesn't? Autocross is all about *driving*. You will either be *completely* on the gas or *completely* on the brakes. Autocross gives you the opportunity to drive like you should never drive on the street, but in a safe, controlled environment. You will learn what your particular car can and cannot do. With the help of our SVR autocross driving instructors, you will gradually learn how to avoid understeer (and oversteer). The ultimate goal being smooth, calculated steering, throttle and braking inputs. One thing is

absolutely certain...afterwards, you will be a better street driver.

stock or consigned cars some of which we have seen as features in magazines. A mint condition guards red low mileage 1979 930 at \$175k drew a lot of attention as did many of the custom low riders recently featured at the Petersen. The center isle called "The Boulevard" featured cars of every make, domestic and foreign, from a '24 Ford custom to the newest being a 1973 911S coupe well worth seeing.

In addition to the many classic Porsches, there were two 914's converted to all electric. One was complete and one was in progress, which when finished sell for about \$65k and perform with the same street presence of a standard 2.0 914 with an additional 50 wheel hp. Hard for me to try to justify \$65k for a range of about 70 miles per charge, no trunk space at all (batteries) and the loss of the sound of that great 2.0 liter at higher rpm's.

The 2nd annual Los Angeles Classic Auto Show of 2018 at the LA Convention Center featured over 1000 cars with guest speakers ranging from Wayne Carini to Don Prudhomme. Chip Foose, Kevin Mack, Dave Kindig, were just a few of the TV personalities from the car realm. In all, over the three-day run of the show over twenty TV personalities were present on the celebrity stage or in the restoration paddock.

Being a bit of a VW nut myself, the show was impressive as it had three Southern Cal VW clubs represented with their full array of split windows, modified, campers, original or restored classics and even a Karmann Ghia or two. Petersen had two classic Porsches from The Vault and there were two or three restorers with their best 356 and car sellers brought their highest value in





The downstairs hall had trucks, trucks, and trucks. We also saw exhibits from the film industry garage. We got to see one of the five original "Eleanor" mustangs from Gone in 60 Seconds, along with the only licensed remanufacturer of the same name. Lots of choices in the new version but the look and the namesake is undeniable.

Our original intention when planning had been to spend one day at The Classic Show at the convention center and one day at the Porsche Effect. Due to an early arrival and 2 additional hours with out the public at The Classic show we were able to do both in one day. We exited The Classic Show about 12:45 and made it to the Petersen for a great lunch at the very crowded Drago Restaurant.

The Porsche Effect: The main floor at the Petersen had some great attention-grabbers. The racing version



of the GT1 and the street going version sitting next to each other, a pristine 904, a dressed up 935, a new 918 and split window 356 cab. Lastly, there's the last production 550 Spyder (s/n #90) that remains the best untouched example of the breed. All of them are in the lobby. We won't spoil for you, but it is extremely well done and it features cars from the Porsches Stuttgart museum as well as owners that volunteered their vehicles. Some we had previously seen in a visit to "The Vault" in December were upstairs and now on full display.

Speaking of The Vault, it's a private guided tour of the underground storage facility at the Petersen. This is a must do if you haven't seen it before. There are cars there that never see the outside or the public display upstairs. The guided tour guide reveals facts and figures about the vehicles that are not well known and its extremely interesting.





You don't have to be a car nut to enjoy the tour either. There is something for everyone to see and hear. Photography is forbidden, so the mystique of the place is on-going.

Remember, that if you are a CAM member, the admission to the display is covered with your reciprocity card. According to the museum's website, this Porsche Effect exhibit lasts through January 2019 and well worth a visit. Bring your camera!

Alex and his wife were flown from Sacramento to San Diego where they were provided a room at the Ramada Gaslamp & Convention Center location, which is in downtown San Diego. Making it convenient for seeing the sights Friday afternoon.

Early the next morning, the Gunnery Sargent picked them up and they headed out to the rifle range. Arriving at the rifle range, they were greeted by members of the Marine Corps Scout Sniper community, where they spent the day practicing short and long range shooting. Alex was instructed in various shooting stances

at varying distances. The Scout Snipers were able to get Alex hitting targets over 700M away! After several hours on the rifle range, Alex and his wife joined the Snipers for lunch to discuss the day and share stories.

Many of those stories I have heard, along with other family members and all his friends.



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
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People, Places, and Porsches



What's in Your Garage

The **Nieslony** garage is home to four Porsche's. **Steve** is an autocross instructor and **Joy** is the outgoing Treasurer for SVR. Active and dedicated members of the SVR, the back story of their life long involvement with Porsche is truly worth telling.

In the early 50's, Norbert, Steve's father, left Germany as a new Porsche employee. Norbert's job was to train mechanics that came from Germany and to validate warranty work. After a stint behind a desk, Norbert left Porsche in the early 60's. Rather than return to Germany, Norbert went to work for the legendary Vasek Polak, the prominent car dealer, racer, collector and racing team owner. Well known in the sports car racing world, he prepared machines for Jack MacAfee, Ken Miles, Jerry Titus and Roger Penske. Vasek was even a part of the Porsche Sebring racing team. Vasek opened the first exclusive Porsche dealership in the United States and built it into a South Bay-based auto empire.

With this kind of technical training, Norbert returned to Northern California and opened his own business. Repairing, restoring and servicing Porsches, Norbert even sold a 356 to two of our current SVR members, Gary and Alma Thompson. In fact, Gary and Alma even recall meeting Steve as "a little guy" when they bought that 356 all those years ago.

Steve got involved with his father's business as a youngster and reflects with pride on his dad's work ethic: "he built race cars to promote the business; he worked on those after regular business hours or before breakfast".

While in college, Steve got involved in the business and also began to autocross with Norbert. Their autocross car was a 1962 Ruby Red 356 with black interior. Norbert bought the car back from a customer in 1982 and together, he and Steve restored the numbers matching 356. The original 60 horse power motor was replaced by a Super 90 engine installed for auto crossing.

The ruby red 356 resides in the Nieslony's garage (along with the original engine on an engine stand) as a marvelous reminder of the time spent with Norbert restoring the car.

Along with the 356, a pair of 914's share garage space. The '72 914 has been stripped down and turned into an autocrosser. The silver '73 914 was purchased for \$1,500 in 1985. For the next 15 years, Steve and Norbert

autocrossed the '73 which is Steve's daily driver. A white/sand beige 2007 Cayman S rounds out the collection of mid-engine Porsches.


The One That Got Away

You can't help but wonder about the ones that got away. The array of early luftgekuhlt Porsche's that must have come into the business for sale or repair has to have been stunning. Steve relates how Norbert had restored a 1960 356 Cabriolet including the engine and interior. The asking price was \$22,000. A customer came in and wanted to trade a '55 550 Spyder plus \$2,000 for the 356. Steve relates how he pleaded with his dad to do the deal, but to no avail. A quick search on the

internet revealed a '55 550 Spyder sold for \$3.685 million in 2012. Regardless of the one that got away, without a doubt, the '62 Ruby Red 356 Porsche handed from father to son is truly priceless.

Conclusion

Thanks to Steve and Joy Nieslony for their many contributions to SVR and for taking time out to share their family's Porsche legacy. As if I had any doubt about Steve's commitment to Porsche, Steve reminded me in closing that "I still own every Porsche I've ever purchased". There aren't many of us that can make that statement.



Roadwise

Over the past few weeks, I have received inquiries referencing the Michael Justis article in the April issue of the Drifter. The article highlighted four key tips to consider when purchasing a clear bra for your vehicle and peaked our members interest. It is well worth the read. The inquires I have received related to questions about costs to re-spray or full paint on the hood damaged by rock chips. I suggest you contact our Body Shop advertisers to discuss your specific requirements. They can give you precise information on your particular situation. Also, I received questions asking how long an owner should wait after a paint job before having a clear bra installed. The reason for the question is rather simple. Put the clear bra on before the paint is fully dry, then and when the bra is removed the paint comes off and you require an expensive paint job.

I contacted local Drifter advertisers to get their professional opinion on the matter. Terri Parra of Bertolucci's **Body and Fender** recommended the longer the better (90 days plus), but a very, very minimum of 30 days. Jake Tomlinson owner of Tomlinson's **Collision Repair** recommends 90 days minimum in compliance with Porsche spec parameters. This waiting time period allows for baked on-paint to complete the off-gassing process. **Michael Justis of Appearance Solutions** will not apply a clear bra unless the new paint has cured for a minimum of 30 to 60 days. He favors the 90 day guidelines as well.

In review, it's a difficult decision to make as a Porsche owner. You pay for a new paint job and want the clear bra on the hood before rocks start chipping away at the new paint. On the other hand, you do not want to keep their car

garaged during the SVR tour season. Also, if you bought a car with an older bra on it and its time to be replaced, you hope for a smooth transition with no costly and nasty surprises.

According to our experts, apply in haste, regret at leisure.
