### Porsche Turns 70: Let the Party Begin

The first vehicle to bear the Porsche name was registered on June 8, 1948. This car is known as the 356/1 Roadster and was constructed in Gmünd, Austria. The Type 356 was Ferdinand Porsche's culmination of a dream to develop a revolutionary type of sports car. Being imprisoned in France for 22 months delayed the production a bit and his son "Ferry" Porsche carried on the dream, turning the 356 into a reality. Sometimes overlooked, the actual designer of the 356 was Porsche's chief designer Erwin Komenda. He was also credited for helping design the VW Beetle, 550 Spyder, 911 and many other notable sports cars. Let there be no doubt, the immense development work accomplished by Ferdinand Porsche ten years earlier in 1938 with the Type 64 "KdF Berlin-Rome car" played an instrumental part of developing the 356 before the marque was officially born. Six months ago, Porsche AG rang in 2018 with a very high profile reception at their Stuttgart museum. A who's-who

list of attendees packed the room. There, they announced "Sportscar Together Day". The event will be held on June 9<sup>th</sup> at dealerships all over the world and will occur just about the time you are reading this.

Oliver Blume, the CEO of Porsche AG honored Ferdinand Porsche stating, "His vision at that time embodied all of the values that still define the brand to this day." Blume went on to say, "Tradition is a commitment. Without our tradition and without our core values, we would not be where we are today. We plan to uphold the standard of technical excellence set by Ferry Porsche well into the future. We have what it takes to ensure that the Porsche brand continues to fascinate—even in another 70 years."

No doubt, the soon to be released **Mission E** was a prominent focus of the reception. The all electric, four door sedan is rated at 600 HP with an average range of 310 miles. The all electric vehicle is a major shift of direction but in reality is a return to Porsche's

grassroots since Porsche pioneered electric vehicles in the late 1890's. Most Porschephiles get the jitters when Stuttgart makes dramatic moves. Remember when Porsche announced that the 991 would have electric power steering and that shift to water cooled flat sixes? There was plenty of outrage from the purists to go around. Some still say PDK isn't pure enough either. To counter this sort of thing, CEO Oliver Blume tried to quell those worries by stating, "-don't worry, "Porsche will always be Porsche—the leading brand for exclusive, sporty mobility." This month's cover commemorates Porsche's beginning and Porsche's future.

My wife Lisa and I will be at Niello Porsche on June 9<sup>th</sup> for the big Sportscar Together Day. Hope to see ya there!

year and occur somewhat remote to the location of the Parade. Treffen is oriented toward social and tours. There are no competitive events.


### **Rennsport Reunion Parade Laps**




Join SVR and Visit the Cobra Museum for a taste of the history of one of the worlds most famous and sought after cars.

Alma Thompson and Liz Houser busied themselves with giving out tickets for the Share the Wealth that we traditionally do after dinner is finished.


One unique thing about the dinner is it was on a Sunday and started later in the afternoon with cocktail hour at 4:00

or elsewhere, I highly recommend it! Thanks to both for such a great time! PS See you on the July 13 Snake Bite



Soon the music began, and it was fantastic! Ann did most of the singing, with back-up vocals done by Steve. Ann played acoustic guitar, Steve played








# M\_AX Fun By Ed Busuttil, SVR Autocross Chair


What a great way to start our regular SVR autocross season! From our pool of 52 drivers we had representation from the GGR (6), RR (2), YOS (2), DIA (1), SVR (30), and 11 non-PCA members who may someday join this wonderful club. We had 17 drivers with four or fewer AX events, including a number that attended the Autocross School in March. If you are one of the drivers attending your first few events PLEASE reach out to us and let us know how we did and what we can do to make things better. We look forward to your input (autocross@svr-pca.org)

The course was designed by our course design master, **Kent Treiber**. There were good speed portions, and a number of sneaky corners that punished your time if you hugged them too early. Additionally, some sharp turns tested your vehicle's braking ability. If you hit your braking points correctly you were rewarded, but if you missed them, you knew it immediately, as your car pushed WAY too far.



<u>Average Times:</u> Average run times progressed well for the morning set of four runs and then progressed more slowly in the afternoon.

Top Times of Day: We had a whopping 77% of participants get their TTOD in the afternoon runs. The final run counted for over a 1/3 of the best runs of the day. TTOD was set quickly by **Steve Nieslony** with a first run of 35.552. Steve followed that up in the 2<sup>nd</sup> run by dropping almost two seconds with a time of 33.734. His 4<sup>th</sup> run of 33.520 was the TTOD. We had three individuals making it to the 34's. **Alan Patterson** at 34.467, **Derek Boyd** at 34.890 and **Susan Fontaine** at 34.897.



Ladies Top Time: The top time changed hands a number of times. Susan nudged out Joy Nieslony on the first run by a mere 0.11 seconds. Joy then bested Susan by 0.74 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> run. But Susan came back and was a ½ second ahead of Joy. On Joy's final run she ran her best time of 36.247. Susan then blasted through the course and garnered a time that surprised even her at 34.897.

### Fun Stuff:

<u>Consistency</u>: One of the fun measures is consistency. This takes a driver's three best runs of the day and determines a standard deviation for those runs. Standard deviation is an indication of the variance from the mean value of your best three runs. (The lower the value, the more consistent your runs.) <u>Larry Kirkbride</u> varied by a mere 88/1000 of a second!






**PAX** (Performance Adjustment Index) is an adjusted time based on assigned handicaps according to vehicle make/model/year and level of modification. This adjustment allows for comparison of times on a more even basis. The top five PAX times for our PCA members were close. Fraser Marshall ended up on top of the board (S10-2001 Boxster) with a time of 34.462. Carl Winkler (P15-2007 Cayman) in 2<sup>nd</sup> at 32.869, Derek Boyd (P16 - 981) at 32.250, Steve Nieslony (M01-914) with 33.285, and David Schnitzer (P08-911) at 33.757.

Most Improved (new to SVR events): Average times for our new drivers showed a big drop between the first and second runs. This was followed by slower improvements on the way to the final run, where most had their best time of the day. The biggest improvement came from **Lisa Shepard** with an 18% improvement. Serene Nispiros improved by 17% during the day, as did Patricia Zajic. Kelly Murphy saw a 12% improvement over the course of the day. Finally, Dennis Fay improved 11% by the end of the day. Wonderful job everyone!

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

# Guidelines for submission of material to the Drifter



**Articles** 

Please submit articles as a Microsoft Word document or in plain text format. While we can accept PDF files, it adds extra steps for the editors to get the material out for for editing. <u>Most articles should run about 2 to 3 pages of single spaced text.</u> We will reformat and edit your article anyway, no matter how pretty it looks, so please send it in correctly the first time.

**Event flyers** 

We can accept either Word or PDF formats, but Word is preferred. Space limitations in the Drifter currently limit event flyers to  $\frac{1}{2}$  page; full page flyers will automatically be re-formatted into a  $\frac{1}{2}$  page size. Don't fret over creating a "killer design" event flyer; just send us the basic details and we will do the rest.

**Photographs** 

Photographs add significant quality and interest to most articles. We would like to have a number of your photographs to accompany your articles, although space limitations and editorial decisions may not permit all of them to be published. Whenever possible, the photographer who took the picture will be credited when the information is available. For any photograph submitted to the Drifter, it must be in the largest size (with the most pixels) possible! This means the actual size as it comes off your camera, computer, phone, iPad or whatever. If you email it to us from your computer or phone, use "actual size" for emailing, not photos which have been resized for quick email transmission. Photographs taken off of a website generally won't work for our print publication because of their small size. If you send photographs on a CD, save the save them in the largest size possible. JPEG, TIFF or Photoshop (PSD) formats are all OK

Embedded photos in Microsoft Word are fine to accompany your articles, as long as you send us the "full size" versions as well. Sorry, but we can't accept a Word file with only embedded photos in the text.

We would like to use photographs on the entire cover page whenever possible. Photographs taken in the "portrait mode" lend themselves to a full cover shot better than other formats. if you would like us to consider your photograph for the cover of the Drifter, please consider taking it in "portrait mode" as opposed to the more common "landscape mode". Again, the photographs must be sent in the largest version possible to give a proper size image for the cover.


