Editor's Corner Matt Menning, Editor **Photo Jeff Kinder & Porsche**

Porsche has already enjoyed 3 great quarters this year. It's been particularly strong in Europe with a nine percent iump to 66.551 units. In Germany. the deliveries increased by 13 percent to 24,709 vehicles. Over in China, Porsche's largest single market, was

up four percent with 56,254 vehicles delivered. Of all the models. the Panamera showed the largest increase. By the end of September, deliveries of the big four-door increased by 60 percent. The 911 also saw double-digit growth with a plus of 19 percent. King of the hill remains the Macan with 68,050 delivered vehicles and the Cavenne with 49,715 delivered units. In spite of a few challenges, Porsche's Executive Sales Board, assumes that they will achieve the record of last year when 246,375 vehicles

were delivered to customers. The fourth quarter will bring even tighter European regs on emissions. This includes the changeover to the new WLTP test cycle and petrol particulate filters. I'm now reminded of the famous quote: The beatings will continue until the moral improves".

Porsche has not offered any diesel models since the middle of February

2018. At the end of September, the Executive Board made a final decision to cease production of all diesel-powered vehicles. At the same time. Porsche is experiencing a growing interest in their hybrid models. For example, more than 60 percent of the Panameras were



delivered with plug-in hybrid drive in Europe. The average price of gasoline in Europe roughly equates to \$5.68 / US gallon. Obviously that's a big driver of what people buy -when they are shopping for a large, heavy vehicle.

Porsche Digital announced a few months ago they are investing in a US start-up company named "Miles". The company is based in San Jose, California and founded in 2016. It is launching the

first smartphone-based rewards program for all forms of travel.

I see that Porsche is tweeting more "Porsche Sound Nacht" clips. These are great and can be found elsewhere on the web as well. Recently, they brought in their 98' GT1. Turn up the volume!

Porsche has announced 2 new subscription programs (Porsche Drive and Porsche Host) to expand your drive in their automobiles. This is in addition to the Porsche Passport program launched a year ago (although limited to the Atlanta area). These programs are targeting millennials whose lifestyle has been

shaped by companies such as Uber, Lyft and Airbnb. Other manufactures also have similar subscriptions programs (BMW, Mercedes Benz, Cadillac, and Volvo). Many of these combine the lease, insurance, and maintenance into one monthly payment.

The Porsche Drive program is only available in Atlanta so we will pass on that one (must have something to do with the fact that Porsche Cars North America is located there).

Porsche Host is only available on the West Coast (now we are talking). Porsche has teamed up with Turo (the person-to-person car sharing folks) to offer Porsche-approved and trained Turo hosts (read as "private car owners") in Los Angeles and San Francisco. The cars are owned by the hosts and you can book them using the Turo app or website. You can rent for a day, a week, a month, or longer. Turo has been described as the 'Airbnb for Cars'.




bringing hot food as the Museum has had difficulty keeping everything warm in the past.






M_AX Fun By Greg Zajic, SVR Autocross Co-Chair



What a great finale for the 2018 season! The autocross team had a fantastic course design for the final event of the 2018 season. For our finale, we had an "enduro course". The team had talked about doing one for some time but at the suggestion of course designer, **Kent Treiber**, we decided to go for it. If you are not familiar with what an endure event is, it is a timed 2-3 laps around the course and is unlike the single timed lap we normally run. An enduro puts a lot of emphasis on driver consistency while also rewarding those who can be aggressive in attacking the course consistently. We had with a total of 50 drivers on that Saturday. Everyone got a total of 6 two lap runs. The temperatures were reasonable, the setup went well and we got things started right on time.


From our pool of 50 drivers we had region representation from the GGR (5), DIA (3), RR (1), YOS (1), SVR (34), and 6 non PCA members. We had total of 14 drivers with three or fewer AX events, including 10 that were first time SVR AX attendees. I believe one first timer is hooked already! If you are one of the drivers attending your first few events, PLEASE reach out to us and let us know how we did and what we can do to make things better. 
The course design was a collaborative design. As usual we had **Kent Treiber** who received a bit of assistance from **Greg Zajic**. **Please note, if you liked a particular aspect of the course, please give Greg credit, any complaints should be directed to Kent. Our course had a good mix of speed and finesse. The course started off with a series of straights broken up by less than 90 degree angles allowing everyone to get the RPM's up. Followed by a fairly tight 180, and a series of esses that led to the first lap bypass. As you entered the bypass at speed you realized it was MUCH narrower than what you recalled from your prior course walk. You then proceeded a second time through the course and ended with a mad dash to the finish to get that best time. There was a good mix of items that required you to finish a few sections off just right so you were lined up for the next one... miscalculations lead to slower times. Nice job on the design!

Average Times: Average run times progressed as well for the first three runs and took a good dip in the afternoon as temperatures warmed up and tires garnered a bit more grip. Average times for the last three set of runs was unusually tight and overall stayed within about ¾ of a second.

Top Times of Day: We had a significant number of drivers getting their top times in the afternoon with a full 76% of drivers getting their TTOD in the afternoon. We had an event high of 45% getting top time on the final run of the day.



Men's Top Time: Top time of day changed hands only one time during the day and there were only three individuals to break the 60 second barrier. Ovidiu Predescu set the bar with a first run time of 59.961. Steve Nieslony was hot on hit heels, but a cone dashed his chances. Ovidu shaved off ¾ off his second run with a 59.197 and kept Steve at bay. Steve kept looking for where to pick up speed and found that keeping things in 2nd gear rather than touching third did




the trick. The fifth run, he nabbed a 58.235 which held through the sixth and final run. A race for third and fourth was tight as well. Through the first three runs, **Alan Booth** and **John Leet** were neck and neck. During the afternoon runs John Leet shaved 1.25 seconds off his best morning time. On his sixth and final run, he set a time just of 60.220. Alan did his best on the next two runs but was still 2/10^{ths} slower than John... On the sixth run Alan tied all the turns together and managed to be only one of three to dip in the sub 60's with a time of 59.985 with a tire screeching stop after crossing the finish line and oh so close to a cone and finished up the course with a clean run and bragging rights.


<u>Ladies Top Time</u>: For the ladies top time we had a first run time and target set by **Robin Fong** of 68.294. **Lynne Sperry** was a close second with **Samantha Guerin**, and **Deborah Guerin** all within a second on that first run. Samantha Guerin then found her stride in the second run and shaved off a whopping five seconds with a second run time of 67.026 resetting the bar. Through the rest of the runs the ladies times improved but Samantha's time held through the sixth run garnering her the ladies TTOD!

<u>PAX</u> (Performance Adjustment Index) is an adjusted top time based on assigned handicaps based on vehicle make/model/year and level of modification and handicaps are based on actual performance of cars in multiple PCA AX events over the years. The adjustment allows for comparison of times on a more even playing field. Top 5 PAX times of for our PCA members were close but **Carl Winkler** (P15-2007 Cayman) had a solid final run putting him into the first PAX spot with a time of 56.677. **John Leet** (S11-2012 911S) in 2nd at 56.908 with **Darin Smith** (S15 2012 Panamera) at 57.035, **Ovidiu Predescu** (S12-2016 GT4) with 57.125 and **Alan Booth** (P16 – 2010 Boxster) at 57.166

<u>Most Improved (new to SVR events)</u>: Average times for our new drivers showed nice improvements between a first run and best run which was 5%. That equates to around 3.5 seconds. The biggest improvement came from **Danny Tang** with 9.6% or 7.2 seconds, during the day scoring a best run time of 67.939 on his 4th run of the day. **Robert Laliberte** improved by 7.4% during the day and shaved off 5.9 seconds with a time of 73.225 on the 6th run. **Nick Shrader** 6% with an improvement of 4.5 seconds and a best time of 65.622, **David Sathe** 6.2% and time of 70.460, and **Chris Chow** 4.1 seconds and best time of 65.146. Wonderful job everyone!

<u>Coneage</u>: We ended up with a Mere 50 cones bumped out of the box (1/2 of last months), thrown in the air or downright squashed. Things started reasonably looking bad for the cones but leveled out reasonably for the most part. One person accounted for 16% of the total...





hitting any cones (*Please keep the course workers from getting bored... hit some cones*). That left a record low 26 individuals responsible for the quivering cones and keeping the course workers awake. There are a few caveat's to this honor... you need to have attended 5 or more SVR events/be a regular attendee and generally it won't be awarded to back to back events to the same person unless you REALLY earn it. **The King and Queen awards come with a crown magnet that you "get to" put on your vehicle for the next event!**

<u>Queen</u> – This award seems to have become a family affair. Samantha Guerin Won the award last month. **Deborah Guerin** was likely jealous so on her third run decided to send 3 cones FLYING (there was no mercy shown) on the back straight just before the tight 180. We had to hold the next car briefly so we could re-set those scattered cones. All we have to do now is remember to award her the magnet at the first event next year. Please help us remember.

<u>Cone King:</u> Talking about a family affair... **Wayne Guerin** also was feeling a bit Jealous of Samantha's special magnet. He held clean runs through the morning three then in the afternoon decided to take out two cones in his fourth run, three in his fifth run and likely realized he was tied with **Tosh Yumae** at 5 cones a piece so for good measure he took out three more on his sixth run just to cement his top of the cone count board. The things we do for that first place prize... *no we're not competitive...* so the first event will be a family affair with both king and queen being from the same family. I believe this is a first!

AX Improving your times—Don't forget that the SVR autocross team is here to help you continue improving your car handling skills so PLEASE reach out to members of the AX team for input, advice, or coaching as you continue honing your skills. Coaching is not for just the NEW drivers, it's for everyone. If you've hit "that plateau" let us know. We're happy to help and if requested ride along and provide additional coaching or suggestions for fine tuning of your driving as you skills progress. Our instructors frequently ride in each other's cars and provide pointers or ideas. Reach out to us. We look forward to seeing you in 2019. Keep an eye out in the drifter as the new year approaches for registration information for the 2019 autocross school!

Guidelines for submission of material to the Drifter



Articles

Please submit articles as a Microsoft Word document or in plain text format. While we can accept PDF files, it adds extra steps for the editors to get the material out for for editing. <u>Most articles should run about 2 to 3 pages of single spaced text.</u> We will reformat and edit your article anyway, no matter how pretty it looks, so please send it in correctly the first time.

Event flyers

We can accept either Word or PDF formats, but Word is preferred. Space limitations in the Drifter currently limit event flyers to ½ page; full page flyers will automatically be re-formatted into a ½ page size. Don't fret over creating a "killer design" event flyer; just send us the basic details and we will do the rest.

Photographs

Photographs add significant quality and interest to most articles. We would like to have a number of your photographs to accompany your articles, although space limitations and editorial decisions may not permit all of them to be published. Whenever possible, the photographer who took the picture will be credited when the information is available. For any photograph submitted to the Drifter, it must be in the largest size (with the most pixels) possible! This means the actual size as it comes off your camera, computer, phone, iPad or whatever. If you email it to us from your computer or phone, use "actual size" for emailing, not photos which have been resized for quick email transmission. Photographs taken off of a website generally won't work for our print publication because of their small size. If you send photographs on a CD, save the save them in the largest size possible. JPEG, TIFF or Photo-

shop (PSD) formats are all OK

Embedded photos in Microsoft Word are fine to accompany your articles, as long as you send us the "full size" versions as well. Sorry, but we can't accept a Word file with only embedded photos in the text.

We would like to use photographs on the entire cover page whenever possible. Photographs taken in the "portrait mode" lend themselves to a full cover shot better than other formats. if you would like us to consider your photograph for the cover of the Drifter, please consider taking it in "portrait mode" as opposed to the more common "landscape mode". Again, the photographs must be sent in the largest version possible to give a proper size image for the cover.


