

Car Emergency Road Kit

So it is winter time and you want to make sure that you have your car prepared for that dreadful experience of being stuck out in bad weather. So here are a few tips from one of the insurance companies as to what to have in your kit:

- Flares and Lighting
 - You want to be seen so have flares or reflective triangles

- Consider LED flares (batteryoperated)
- A flashlight (or two), especially a multi-use version that flashes
- Jumper Cables
 - Nice to have if AAA is going to take 2 hours to get to you
- First Aid Kit
 - Purchase a pre-packed one and add items of your own choosing
- Car Fluids and Tools
 - A can of tire inflator and sealant (your Porsche may or may not run as far as you think it will on those 'run flat' tires)
 - o A quart of motor oil
 - o Bottled water
 - Long-lasting foods such as granola or energy bars
 - o Blankets, gloves, hats
 - Toolkit that has screwdrivers, pliers, adjustable wrench (if not already in your Porsche toolkit)
- Winter Items
 - o Ice scraper (or a credit card)
 - Spray bottle with washer fluid
 - Snow chains (got the correct size for the correct tire on your vehicle?)
- Rotate out replaceable items
 - Replace batteries and consumables every 3-6 months
 - This means water, food, bandages you stole from the first aid kit, etc.

In Phoenix, finishing college, I met another set of welcoming PCA members




in the Arizona Region. I served as Treasurer, Newsletter Editor, and President during my brief five years in the desert.

with Golden Gate Region for two terms in 1999-2000.


Two years ago, Karen and I moved to Roseville, where I transferred my membership to SVR.








Christmas Dinner and Charity Auction Re-cap




Don't Miss Out!

machines, the Petersen **Automotive Museum** presents "The Porsche Effect". No less than 55 exhibits are on exclusive loan from the Porsche Museum. Dozens of SVR members have already made the trip to see this very exclusive display.



I am honored to announce that I have been appointed by PCA's Executive Council to replace Sandy Provasi as your new Zone 7 Rep for the 2019-2020 term. Sandy has done a fabulous job over the last 3-1/2 years as our Zone Rep. With 20 plus years of PCA experience and the help of her equally experienced husband, Tom, I will have a tough act to follow. I would very much like to thank Sandy for her service and hope that I can continue in her footsteps.

I have been a member of PCA and the Sacramento Valley Region since 2007 when I became actively involved in the region's autocross program. Several years after joining, I served as the club's autocross chair from 2012 to 2013 and again for one year in 2017. My regional board experience includes serving as the club's competition and safety chair from 2014-2015 and club president from 2015 to 2016. In 2016 the Sacramento Valley Region was selected as the PCA Region of the Year. For the past two years I have served as the club's past president as well as on our newsletter committee that publishes the award winning newsletter, the Drifter. I also served as the Zone 7 autocross chair in 2018.

Although many members have an understanding of the role of the Zone Rep, I thought I would spend a little time explaining. As defined by the PCA Bylaws, the Zone Rep's responsibilities are described below:

The National Bylaws state the Zone Reps are "responsible for the welfare and progress of the Regions within their zones". In fact, the Zone Reps are a bridge or liaison between the National and local organizations, working on behalf of the Regions and their members to enhance the membership experience, and to avail the Regions of opportunities offered through PCA. The Zone Rep position was originally created in 1969, when the Executive Council (EC) realized the club had grown too big for them to have direct relationships with all the Regions. They subdivided the country, aggregating the Regions into groups which evolved over time into the 14 Zones we now have. Each Zone has a Zone Rep, a position created to facilitate communication between the EC and the Region Officers.

The Zone Reps are emphatically not "Zone Presidents"; they do not direct or oversee Region Presidents. Rather they are a communications and management resource for the Regions in their Zone,

and communicate the Region's interests at the National level as appropriate.

The Zone 7 volunteer board consists of the Zone Rep, a secretary and a treasurer who each serve 2 year terms. The zone secretary and treasurer are approved by the presidents of the regions. The volunteer zone board members include, Rik Larson, Secretary, Larry Adams, Interim Treasurer, Richard Chew, Webmaster, John D'Angelo, Concours Chair, and Grady Carter, Autocross Chair.

The 10 regions which comprise Zone 7 include Redwood, Shasta, Sequoia, Sierra Nevada, Golden Gate, Loma Prieta, Sacramento Valley, Diablo, Monterey Bay, and Yosemite. As all of the regions begin their planning process for 2019, I will use this column to inform you of zone wide events that range from our yearly Zone 7 Tour, Concours and Autocross Series. 





Guidelines for submission of material to the Drifter



Articles

Please submit articles as a Microsoft Word document or in plain text format. While we can accept PDF files, it adds extra steps for the editors to get the material out for for editing. Most articles should run about 2 to 3 pages of single spaced text. We will reformat and edit your article anyway, no matter how pretty it looks, so please send it in correctly the first time.

Event flyers

We can accept either Word or PDF formats, but Word is preferred. Space limitations in the Drifter currently limit event flyers to ½ page; full page flyers will automatically be re-formatted into a ½ page size. Don't fret over creating a "killer design" event flyer; just send us the basic details and we will do the rest.

Photographs

Photographs add significant quality and interest to most articles. We would like to have a number of your photographs to accompany your articles, although space limitations and editorial decisions may not permit all of them to be published. Whenever possible, the photographer who took the picture will be credited when the information is available. For any photograph submitted to the Drifter, it must be in the largest size (with the most pixels) possible! This means the actual size as it comes off your camera, computer, phone, iPad or whatever. If you email it to us from your computer or phone, use "actual size" for emailing, not photos which have been resized for quick email transmission. Photographs taken off of a website generally won't work for our print publication because of their small size. If you send photographs on a CD, save the save them in the largest size possible. JPEG, TIFF or Photoshop (PSD) formats are all OK

Embedded photos in Microsoft Word are fine to accompany your articles, as long as you send us the "full size" versions as well. Sorry, but we can't accept a Word file with only embedded photos in the text.

We would like to use photographs on the entire cover page whenever possible. Photographs taken in the "portrait mode" lend themselves to a full cover shot better than other formats. if you would like us to consider your photograph for the cover of the Drifter, please consider taking it in "portrait mode" as opposed to the more common "landscape" mode". Again, the photographs must be sent in the largest version possible to give a proper size image for the cover.
