# Porsche's worldwide deliveries in 2018 break sales records

Porsche AG delivered 256.255 vehicles worldwide in 2018, more than ever before. This represents an overall growth of four percent compared to the previous record the year before. Of the model series, the Panamera recorded the strongest growth with a 38 percent increase to 38,443. The 911 also experienced a double-digit rise: Despite the release of a new generation late in 2018, 911 deliveries increased by ten percent to 35,573 vehicles. The Macan was still the most successful model by volume with 86,031 vehicles, just ahead of the Cayenne with 71,458 deliveries. Let's not forget, Porsche stopped offering models with diesel engines back in February 2018

The Chinese market has clearly been Porsche's strongest. Growth in the Chinese market reached 12% in 2018 but with the massive recession now in full swing there, 2019 will surely not deliver another strong return. Porsche's second strongest market is the USA. There was a 3% increase in sales (57,202 vehicles). Deliveries in Europe came in slightly below the previous year's figures. (-4%). The combined Asia-Pacific, Middle East market reported

sales gains of 10%. In summary, Porsche saw gains everywhere but in their home turf of Europe. The looming trade tariffs between the US and Germany are still in flux and could potentially hurt sales in very big ways. Stay tuned on that. As of December, there was still plenty of uncertainty but manufacturers such as BMW won't be hurt nearly as much as Porsche since BMW has a big assembly plant in South Carolina. All of their X Series SUV's are made there.

#### **Demographics**

If California was a country, it would be Porsche's 5th largest market in the world. The Los Angeles Basin is the strongest market with the SF Bay Area right behind. The U.S. Porsche Experience Centers are proving to be a success. This past summer, they reached the milestone of a combined 250,000 visitors. Based on compiled sales data, the proportion of female customers in the U.S. is 24% and the Macan has the highest share of women buyers with around 33%.

# The new 2020 Porsche 911 Carrera S and 4S Cabriolet

There's continued buzz about the 992. After the big premiere of the

eighth generation of Porsche 911 in Los Angeles early last year, the latest generation of 911 Carrera S and 4S Cabriolet models made their debut in Atlanta several weeks later. The cab's automatic fabric top opens or closes in about 12 seconds while driving speeds of up to 31 miles per hour. All of the 911 models will have the same wide body styling. A new eight-speed PDK (dualclutch) transmission complements the flat-six turbocharged engine that makes 443 horsepower in the S model. Joining the increase in engine performance, the PASM Sport Suspension features stiffer springs, sway bars as well as an optional 10 mm lower ride height on the new 911 Carrera S and 4S Cabriolet models. Previously, it was only available for S and GT Coupe models. A manual transmission will be available at a later date. With the exception of the front and rear fasciae, the entire outer skin will be made of aluminum. The 2020 911 Carrera S Cabriolet has a base MSRP of \$126,100, while the 2020 911 Carrera 4S Cabriolet will be offered starting at \$133,400, each not including the \$1,250 delivery, processing and handling fees. The models can be ordered now and are expected to reach U.S. dealers later this summer.

#### **Taycan Production Increased**

Evidently Porsche is so impressed with orders that it is increasing its target production from the original 20,000 units to closer to 40,000 units. It seems that a lot of current Tesla owners have signed up for the new Taycan.

#### Speed Limit on the Autobahn

A proposal to limit the speed limit on the German highways to 81 mph (130 kph) is causing outrage. Supporters of the proposal say that the reduction in speed would reduce air pollution, and reduce the number of accidents.

#### FIA Formula E season has started

The electric open-wheel racing season is underway. Three of the 13 races have already been completed (Saudi Arabia, Morocco, and Chile). This is the fifth season for the cars and sees the introduction of the Gen2 specification (more power, higher top speeds, standardized battery, new brakes, "halo" cockpit protection, 45 minute races plus 1 lap, and no longer needing mid-race car-swaps). Car manufacturers already involved include: Audi, Jaguar, Spark/Penske, Nissan, and BMW/Andretti. Porsche will enter this

series next season (December 2019). The next race is in Mexico City on February 16th. You can usually catch the live TV broadcast on Fox Sports (hosted by Steve Matchett).

I am excited to assume the role as Autocross Chair for the 2019 season, taking the reins from Ed Busuttil who executed a stellar season last year. I



have big shoes to fill! Thankfully, SVR is blessed with a very seasoned and dedicated team.

Just two years ago, I signed up for SVR's autocross school as a relative newcomer to SVR and interested in learning more about driving my Porsche. I was instantly hooked! For anyone looking for a safe way to learn the limits of your car, I strongly recommend the class, which is a 2 day event to be held on March 30<sup>th</sup> and April 6<sup>th</sup> this year. The school will be chaired by veteran autocrosser Matt Deter. The first day is a classroom setting held at

Niello Porsche in Rocklin and covers topics such as terminology, car control basics, hitting the apex, braking, how to determine the fastest line, safety rules, and what to expect in your first event. A continental breakfast and lunch will be provided.

Day two, the following week, will be held at our regular autocross site at the San Joaquin Fairgrounds in Stockton. This provides students the



opportunity to put the information learned at the ground school into practice. Various in-car exercises such as braking, slalom and skid pad experience will be performed while riding with an instructor. Later in the day, participants will have the opportunity for full course

runs that will be timed. Loaner helmets will be available.

The 2019 season consists of a total of 7 events that kicks off with our first autocross on May 4th. For the final two events in September and October we move to Thunderhill Raceway



in Willows. Last year, we had one event at Thunderhill, and although it was a very hot day, competitors enjoyed the exceptional surface. Temperatures for our events this year should be a bit cooler later in the season. Two of the SVR events (June and October) are part of the Zone 7 competition.





## 2018 LA Auto Show: Automobility Conference

As can be seen by noting the title the LA AUTO SHOW has morphed in to a conference of characters intent on bringing together key innovative experts, industry developers and companies that will be influencing the future of transportation. The conference began on Monday with a B2B networking platform of media and

established and emerging automakers combined with a showcase of keynote speakers emphasizing the integration of software and devices into vehicle mobility. This portion of the event runs Monday through Thursday culminating in the actual auto show. It

3. This 911 is now is riding on larger staggered wheels: 11.5 x 21" rear and 8.5 x 20" front. Front is 45mm wider, rear same as old 4S and GTS.

Aluminum intensive body. Electric assisted brake booster (not brake-by-wire) 41% lighter pedal with shorter travel

- Rear Spoiler spans the entire width and exhaust pipes poke through fascia. Longitudinal spoiler fins.
- 5. S lists at \$113,200; 4s lists at \$120,600
- 10.9 inch wide touchscreen,
   5 gauges including an analog tach. Many new features including the world's first WET MODE, adaptive cruise control, night vision assist and thermal imaging camera.
- 7. Engine mounts are moved 6.6" forward, stiffer link between components, active mounts still optional. Torsional rigidity increased by 5% even though amount of steel decreased from 63% to 30%.

Other vehicles in the line showed the same full width tail light. It looks great and is clearly the defining universal feature of the line. On Friday morning, before the show opened to the public. 





## **SVR Member Spotlight**

(Welcome to the initial edition of SVR Membership Spotlight. Our purpose will be to highlight SVR members, old and new, giving some insight into the various ways Porsche ownership, and PCA membership, are enjoyed. Have a member in mind who we'd enjoy putting in the spotlight? Contact editor@svr-pca.org.)

Gary Griffiths first noticed a Porsche, a 911, over 50 years ago, passing by on the streets of Oakland. It took him awhile to take the plunge, but in 1979 he found a modified 911-a 1970 911T that had steel RSR flares welded on to accommodate wide 8" and 10" BBS wheels. Though stock mechanically, it had the look many of us in those days desired. Two years later a 1969 911S was acquired, and being a car still having its original paint and engine,

which led to participatiing, and winning, local concours events.

Living in the Bay Area, Gary joined PCA about that time, in 1981, with Golden Gate Region. He transferred into SVR in 2004, after a brief move to Arizona. With SVR. he hosts the annual Gold Rush Tour, is a regular at Saturday Breakfast, and attending CRAB. He also was part of the 2018 **SVR Nominating** 

Committee for the 2019 ballot. **Gary** and his wife **Judy** enjoy the full variety of events the region offers.

On the National level, he's driven to and attended six Parades—1982 Reno, 1983 Lake of Ozarks, 1985 Costa Mesa, 1990 Monterey, 2000 Sacramento,

Many Porsches have come home to live in his garages over the decades. In 1982 he added to his stable in buying a 1978 911SC Targa, and a 1959 356 Convertible D. Finding the Convertible D wasn't so practical, in 1984 it was traded for a 1964 356 C Coupe. This transaction took place locally, and the Convertible D still resides in the area.

The modification bug hit the big time by 1989—the '78 Targa was

upgraded to a 1995 993 engine (later further enlarged to 3.8L), large "Big Red" brakes, and coil over suspension. The car was stripped, and color changed to black. Excellence magazine profiled the car in the December 1999 issue: "D.I.Y. Guy." Yes, Gary did it all himself, including the painting. Later, a six speed transmission from a 993 was installed.

Gary has a fully equipped garage at home, enabling him to perform any

facet of maintenance and modification necessary.

Since we can't keep them all, the '69 S was sold after 20 years of concours duty, as was the highly modified '78 SC. The '64 C was sold a few years earlier. But as with many of our past cars, they often find long term caretakers. Except for the '64 C, Gary knows the current owner of his past cars.

His current, most recently acquired, 911 was bought in 2004—a black 1996 993 Twin Turbo. It came to him with about 30,000 miles, and now shows over 150,000. Slightly modified, the original, unrebuilt engine still provides power that, 23 years later, is not exceeded by many of even the newest exotics. And even with those miles, the car wouldn't be out of place at our next concours.

How do you put about 10,000 miles a year, year-in-and-out, on such a car?

Touring! Over the past quarter century, Gary has been part of a Western States touring group that has accounted for 90,000 miles. The longest single trip was 8,500 miles. Canada, Texas, a Parade in Missouri--miles of smiles behind the wheel.

Track duty has been light, but he's driven the 993 Twin Turbo locally at Laguna Seca and Thunderhill.

What's next? After nearly 40 years with Porsches and PCA, Gary is still going strong. SVR breakfast those first Saturdays. Another Gold Rush Tour is scheduled for September.



# Guidelines for submission of material to the Drifter



Articles

Please submit articles as a Microsoft Word document or in plain text format. While we can accept PDF files, it adds extra steps for the editors to get the material out for for editing. Most articles should run about 2 to 3 pages of single spaced text. We will reformat and edit your article anyway, no matter how pretty it looks, so please send it in correctly the first time.

Event flyers

We can accept either Word or PDF formats, but Word is preferred. Space limitations in the Drifter currently limit event flyers to ½ page; full page flyers will automatically be re-formatted into a ½ page size. Don't fret over creating a "killer design" event flyer; just send us the basic details and we will do the rest.

Photographs

Photographs add significant quality and interest to most articles. We would like to have a number of your photographs to accompany your articles, although space limitations and editorial decisions may not permit all of them to be published. Whenever possible, the photographer who took the picture will be credited when the information is available. For any photograph submitted to the Drifter, it must be in the largest size (with the most pixels) possible! This means the actual size as it comes off your camera, computer, phone, iPad or whatever. If you email it to us from your computer or phone, use "actual size" for emailing, not photos which have been resized for quick email transmission. Photographs taken off of a website generally won't work for our print publication because of their small size. If you send photographs on a CD, save the save them in the largest size possible. JPEG, TIFF or Photoshop (PSD) formats are all OK

Embedded photos in Microsoft Word are fine to accompany your articles, as long as you send us the "full size" versions as well. Sorry, but we can't accept a Word file with only embedded photos in the text.

We would like to use photographs on the entire cover page whenever possible. Photographs taken in the "portrait mode" lend themselves to a full cover shot better than other formats. if you would like us to consider your photograph for the cover of the Drifter, please consider taking it in"portrait mode" as opposed to the more common "landscape mode". Again, the photographs must be sent in the largest version possible to give a proper size image for the cover.
