Help us- To help you: Getting material into The Drifter

The staff here at the award winning Drifter work very hard to give you a great newsletter every single month of the year. There has been a lot of last minute requests and scrambling in the past two months. I need to send out a reminder of the key elements to ensure placement in The Drifter.

- Notify the editor by the 1st of the month that you intend to submit material for publication in the next issue and how much page space you think you might need. Active and early collaboration is a huge plus here.
- A final (ready to go) version of your article or event flyer must be sent to: editor@svr-pca.org
 no later than 15th day of the preceding month. This does not mean that you can wait until the 11:45PM on the 14th to begin the request process. It takes several hours to create each flyer from scratch. We

- need a few weeks to work with everything.
- Event chairs need to be very pro-active and involved with the promotion of their upcoming events. This means that the chair start the flyer request process at least 3 months before your event date and regularly interacting with the editor as needed. This includes getting your initial "save the date" flyer started and then sending in the additional flyer details to the editor for the final version flyer. Also, it is highly advisable to use email when sending in your material. The request will then be forwarded to our webmaster/ flyer designer who will need your detailed and concise info.
- Photographs must be sent in actual size. Meaning, the largest file (highest resolution) size possible. A minimum of 1-3MB size photos is needed for articles. Portrayal of the images will suffer immensely using low resolution images and should not be used. Candidates for cover photos require images 5MB or larger and a minimum of 200dpi. Cover images need to be shot in portrait mode.

"OUR HISTORY" GUY: Larry Wilson (1930-2019)

When you check out the "Our History" tab on the SVR website, you will find the efforts that Larry Wilson put into telling the stories and documenting the events and changes in Sacramento Valley Region from its very beginnings in 1961.

Larry and Pat join PCA

Larry and wife Pat joined Porsche Club of America (PCA) in June 1961 after buying a new 1961 356B coupe while living in France with their sons Mike and Tim (age 6 and 3). After returning to Sacramento in December they were assigned to Sacramento Valley Region (SVR) when it was established May 7, 1962.

Larry served in various SVR offices: Activities Chair (1966), three terms as president (1968, 1969, 1982), Technical and Competition Chair (1977), twice as Treasurer (1986 and 1993), and five years as newsletter editor (1987-91) for THE DRIFTER. In January 2013, Larry was appointed SVR Historian, a new position. Larry held this position for 4 years.

SVR Charity Auction

For 31 years, 1977 through 2008, Larry was a co-auctioneer with Kirk Bradford at SVR's annual charity auction helping to raise more than \$84,000 for SVR charities. Kirk Bradford commented that "as we did more auctions, Larry and I refined our techniques with the end result being extracting the maximum dollars out of the bidders, no matter how (un)saleable the items might have been. Many fond memories of all of those auctions!"

CRAB

Larry served as CRAB (SVR's multievent weekend) co-chair in 1973 with Bob Becker and 1980 (CRAB NINE) with wife, Pat.

"Drifting Back"

For ten years, May 2001 through December 2010, Larry wrote a monthly column, "Drifting Back," in SVR's newsletter to chronicle 30 years of the region's his-

tory and people. All 360 columns are republished on the region website.

Zone 7 Service

Larry's Zone 7 service includes 15 years (1977-1991) as a Zone 7 autocross school instructor. In 1985 Larry chaired the Zone 7 autocross school in Sacramento. He conducted workshops for Zone 7 newsletter editors in 1991, 1993, 1999, 2000, and 2001. In 2009 he served as an instructor at the Zone 7 concours judges' school.

PCA National Service

Larry's national PCA service includes one year (1969) as a member of the PCA Publication, Publicity & Public Relations Committee, three years (1970-1972) as PANORAMA contributing editor, and five and one-half years (1994-99) as PCA Newsletter Committee Chair helping editors and managing PCA's annual newsletter contest. For two years (1997-1998) he served on the PCA National Nominating Committee, and in 1998-2000 he served as Treasurer, 45th Porsche Parade, that was held in Sacramento. In 2004, 2010 and 2011 he served as a judge in the PCA Newsletter Contest.

Larry also wrote articles for the PCA publication, REGIONFOCUS: August 1988 Volume 2, Number 3, "Desktop Publishing Techniques"; March 1996 Volume 10, Number 2, "The Internet Issue"; and February 1997 Volume 10, Number 5, "Accounting and Region Management." Larry and Pat have attended 24 Porsche Parades (the first in 1962 at Monterey, the last in 2007 at San Diego) receiving numerous Parade rally, autocross, and tech quiz awards.

Awards

Over the years, Larry received several SVR, Zone 7, and national service awards. In 1978 and 1979 Larry and Pat received the SVR Most Active Member award, and in 1984 and 1989 they received the SVR President's Award. In each of the five years as newsletter editor, 1987-1991, Larry received a PCA Newsletter Contest class award (3 firsts,

1 second, 1 third). In 1989 Larry and THE DRIFTER was a class-winner in GRASS-ROOTS MOTORSPORTS magazine's nationwide club newsletter contest.

In 1998 at the Steamboat Springs Porsche Parade, Larry received the PCA Zone Representatives' Award of Merit presented to individuals within PCA whom the Zone Representatives believe have distinguished themselves by outstanding contributions to the Porsche Club of America. In 2004 Larry was among the first group of PCAers selected by Zone 7 regional presidents to be inducted to the Zone 7 Wall of Fame.

Racing

During 1965 thru 1974, Larry ran 66 SCCA regional or national races, three years in his E-Production 1955 356 Speedster, purchased in 1965, then seven years in his Zink Formula Vee. Larry recorded three second-place finishes in the Speedster, two at Vaca Valley Raceway and one at the Port of Stockton. Of the 52 Formula Vee race-starts in California, Oregon and Washington, Larry won 19 races (37%). At Laguna Seca he won 11 of 21 events (52%).

Speedster

In March 2006, Tim (with Larry's help) finished a 10-month project restoring the 1955 Speedster that Larry raced forty years before. Later that year, the Speedster won first in class at the annual SCCA-judged Niello Concours at Serrano in El Dorado Hills. In 2008 Larry entered the Speedster in five Zone 7 annual concours series events winning his series class (S-2). At the 2008 Niello Concours at Serrano, celebrating the 60th Anniversary of Porsche, Larry, Mike, and Tim entered their cars with Mike and Tim each winning their class and Larry winning the Enthusiast Choice Porsche Award.

Family

Larry is survived by his wife Pat, two sons and their wives Mike and Karen, Tim and Joann, four grandsons, one great grandson, and of course, his red '55 Porsche Speedster.





Jack, turns out, was a marketing savant. His innovations with the newsletter included rebranding as Escape Velocity, professional printing in full color on glossy paper, and quarterly publishing for increased quality with a manageable volunteer workload. It wasn't long before we had converted EV into a full magazine complete with front and rear cover, feature stories, and regular columns. To make this possible, Jack took on the responsibility for ad sales, and our magazine became a profitable enterprise. His sales and sponsorship skills were also pivotal in our budding relationship with Porsche of Melbourne. Jack won the Paul **Heinmiller Trophy** for PCA's best region newsletter in 2009. Space Coast Region won the Membership Growth Contest

in 2008 and **Ferry Porsche Trophy** for Region of the Year in 2010. These PCA accolades, recognizing the fun we were having, are highly attributed to Jack's efforts and our best in class relationship with Shay Rowe, Porsche of Melbourne.

I became PCA National Membership Chair in 2009 and I took our Space Coast Region story on the road. I've made presentations to nearly every Region in North America about how their newsletters are important to the veracity

Jack and Lois supported the club with event tchotchkes through their business as distributors for Brown and Bigelow. Jack understood that this stuff was not needed—that it was there to add to the enjoyment of the activity. With the support of Jack, Lois took on the role of Space Coast Region Charity Coordinator. This has added a rewarding element

to our club and brought additional **PCA National Public** Service recognition over the past few years. Scott Kee says it this way, "I didn't realize how much the Roberts were doing the club until they moved away 2016." The behind the spotlight, make it happen, dynamic duo.

There was more to Jack than just Porsche Club. From his stories I'd say he tried at least one of

every sports car imported to America. We had the pleasure of meeting friends and family along the way. We enjoyed hanging out at the Eau Gallie Yacht Club and couples dancing on Friday nights there. It is clear that Jack shared his magic in all circles of his life. But speaking for the Space Coast Region—we are richer in our shared Porsche experiences because of Jack. This is true even if you had never met Jack personally. From that first fateful meeting in 2006 and until I stop dreaming, I will be inspired by Jack Roberts. 

The SVR autocross season is right around the corner and kicks off with our first event on May 4th. As such, I wanted to provide a brief summary of how to prepare for an autocross event.

Autocross is a great opportunity for



you to learn car control skills and how to drive your car at its limit in a safe environment. If you are interested in autocross but missed the opportunity to attend the SVR autocross school, please feel free to come to attend any of our events. We have instructors that are more than happy to spend time with beginners and novices to provide you with all of the basics of autocross and ride with you to help with driving techniques. If you have any questions, please email autocross@svr-pca.org.

Preparing yourself

Bring sun screen, a hat, and wear comfortable clothing. Shoes must be closed toe, no sandals. A portable chair is also nice to have. Water is provided, but many folks bring a small cooler with snacks and drinks. A tire gauge is helpful for adjusting tire pressure. Print your registration materials and waivers, and get a good night's rest!

Helmets

Helmets are required safety equipment for all drivers. Drivers must wear a helmet with a Snell rating of SA2005 or newer. If you do not own an approved Snell rated helmet, the club provides a limited number of loaner helmets that will be issued at check-in.

Preparing your Porsche Check fluid levels (oil, brake,

coolant) prior to the event. Check tire pressures to make sure they are at factory specs, and that your tires have plenty of tread. You may also want to check with your Porsche service provider to see if they can perform a basic safety inspection. Remove all loose items in your glove box and trunk as these items can present a danger while driving. Race day numbers can be made from painter's tape, or regular competitors will register a number with the zone and purchase a set of removable numbers

Event check-in

When you arrive, check in at the SVR trailer. You will need to provide signed waivers, and you will be assigned to a run group and course work station. Course work is important to ensure a successful event. If you are new, the event organizers will provide instruction



for your specific duties. You will be given a score card that should be placed on your windshield that will signal your car for a tech inspection.

Tech Inspection

With your score card placed on your windshield, open your trunk and engine compartment to signal your car is ready for inspection.

Course Walk

We encourage all novices and experienced drivers alike to walk the course prior to the driver's meeting. This can be done individually, or you can join the group for the rookie course walk conducted by an instructor.

Driver's Meeting

A mandatory driver's meeting is conducted prior to the start of each event, where the autocross chair will go over basic safety rules and general iterary of the day's competition.

Run Groups

The number of run groups is dependent on the number of cars participating in the event. Usually there are two or three, and you will alternate running, working the course, or resting.

Once Competition Starts

Pay close attention to other cars on the course. Watch their lines and braking points, how they exit turns and apply the accelerator.

Now it's your turn

Bring your car on grid promptly, and lower your windows prior to entering the course (PCA regulation). If your car has PASM, you should set it to Sport/Sport Plus. Most novices will want to leave PSM active, but as you gain more experience and have comfort with controlling the car, you will most likely improve your times by turning it off.

If you are a novice, you will most likely have an instructor riding along. Listen carefully to his/her instructions. Take your time and don't try to get a fast time on your first run. It is more important to learn the line and the course.

And most importantly – be safe and have fun!! You will start to get a feel for how much you think you can improve your time to set personal goals. There is good camaraderie with other drivers who will be happy to share tips and techniques.
