Electronic registration is here!

After a test period to learn how to use it effectively, we have many of our social events listed with the option to sign up online. As usual, the information about an event is listed on our website www.svr-pca.org, and in our newsletter, The Drifter (both online and printed), and in our emails to your inbox (known as an Eblast). You can read about the event, check the date(s) and decide if you want to go, sign up and pay all at the same time.

If you are online and, on our website, or reading the online version of The Drifter or reading the Eblast in your inbox, you will see a link to the registration page of various events coming up. It will allow you to click on the web link and go to the events website. There will be more information about the event as well as the cost, if any. You then click on the "Tickets" button and put in the number of tickets, your first and last name and an email address so we can contact you with additional information, like route instructions or other important information. You can use a Debit or Credit Card to pay, click the "Pay Now" button and your good to go! For example, you can go to www.svr-pca. org and scroll down where we have listed all the events that are coming up. If you decide to go to the River Cats and Porsches event on June 2, you will see a green "Tickets" on the right side, click it and you will be taken to the events sign up page, fill in the information and go! No checks or finding a stamp and envelope. We can then use the email you gave us to keep you informed as the event gets closer. There is no fee to you to signup electronically.

If you are reading The Drifter online there will be a link in the following places; the calendar of upcoming events usually on page 5, or the new master calendar of all events for the remaining year toward the back the online version and directly in the events flyer. You will be able to click on the link (links are usually blue in color and are <u>underlined</u>) and be taken to the signup page. If you are in your email inbox the same applies - just click and go.

If I'm not in the online version of The Drifter or in my email, I always go to www.svr-pca.org scroll down to the events section, and look for the event I want to sign up for. This also gives me a chance to see other events coming up and who knows, I might sign up for another fun club event! Also check out the new Events page for all our upcoming events!

The Weissach "Marsch"

No manufacturer has come close to Porsche's success through the years at Sebring International Raceway. The Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring on March 19th brought Porsche's win total at the track to 96 -and it certainly didn't come easily. The No. 67 Ford Chip Ganassi Racing Ford GT had dominated the majority of the GT Le Mans (GTLM) class race. A bold move by driver Nick Tandy with about one hour remaining to get by the No. 67 Ford GT of Ryan Briscoe, (who had to pit) ultimately proved to be the winning pass for Tandy and his No. 911 Porsche 911 RSR teammates Patrick Pilet and Frederic

Makowiecki. This is the first driver trio to win the IMSA race at Sebring twice in a row. The No. 912 sister car driven by **Earl** Bamber, Laurens Vanthoor and **Mathieu Jaminet** fell back two laps in the early in the race and finished the thrilling longdistance classic in fifth place. The race was slowed by five full-course cautions, including

a 40-minute yellow flag to start the race due to poor track conditions from a heavy rain Saturday morning. Here is a tour of the GTLM car: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-hrrjPJM6ky

A day earlier, the No. 91 PORSCHE team of **Richard Lietz** and **Gianmaria Bruni** won the FIA/WEC LM GTE 1,000-mile race of the Sports Car World Endurance Championship. The sister Car No. 92 finished in 5th place after a hard fought race. These impressive showings sets the Porsche team up nicely for the



member of the Giant's, their major league partners. On the same note, the Giants will be moving players from their roster to the River Cats lineup to work



2019 Autocross School a Success!

The SVR autocross team hosted our annual autocross school that included a classroom session hosted



by Niello Porsche on March 30th and driving instruction at the San Joaquin Fairgrounds on April 6th. This event was in high demand and sold out very quickly. For those who were not able to participate, we welcome new drivers at any of our autocross events, and have instructors available to work with students individually to help them learn the ins-and-outs of autocross!

For the driving portion of the class, the weather threatened rain early on but cooperated for us and we managed to avoid any issues!!! The morning session provided the opportunity for students to work with instructors on various driving skills, including slalom, skid pad, braking and figure eight.

In the afternoon, we ran an abbreviated autocross competition, where each driver had four runs to practice their skills on a course.

As expected, there was steady improvement in run times through the

afternoon runs as everyone became more familiar with the capabilities of their vehicles and their own driving ability. Average time by a little over 3 seconds through the day. Just shy 48%

> of the drivers captured their best run of the day on their final run... I'm sure a culmination of the experience, comfort levels and in some cases shedding off weight of a coach in the co-pilot seat

aided in the final run successes.

<u>Top Times of Day</u> (TTOD): Stealing a quote from the Secrets of Solo Racing, "It is not always possible to be the best, but it is always possible to

improve your own performance — Jackie Stewart." For Top Time of Day the bar was set on the first run by Matt Petrali with a 50.832 in his first run. Greg Darrah bested that time by almost a second in his

second run with a time of 49.974. Matt Petrali however countered with a second run, personal best for the day of 49.669 which stayed at the top of the leader board for run three but the competition was closing the gap. On the fourth run Tyler Van Spanje dropped in a time very fast time of

49.657 pushing Matt to 2nd place, but not to be outdone **Greg Darrah** found a bit more speed and pushed both Tyler and Matt down a spot by posting time of 49.484 and grabbing the TTOD. Rounding the next four spots we had **Trevor Cazares** at 51.602 close behind we had **Jake Van Spanje** with 51.782 (dad was battling for TTOD... I see some father son competition in the coming season), **Joe Genshlea** 52.044, and Scott Roberts with 53.062.

Ladies Top Time: Ladies top time of the day was delivered by Kelsey Leet with a time of 52.914, with Vicki Fanucchi with at time of 57.072 and ½ a bumper away Deeann Price with 57.124 and Julie Lee close behind at 57.833.


Most Improved: Average times progressed well throughout the day everyone got more familiar with the cars, the course and their own abilities. The Average difference between the all drivers first reasonable run (run one or two) and best run was a mere about 4% which equates to around 2.5 seconds. The biggest improvement came from

Julie Lee who consistently shaved off time on each and every run ad improved by a total of 9.4 seconds for a 14% improvement. Al Price III shaved off 4.8 seconds for a 7% improvement, followed by James Burton, and Albert Dennis both shaving

off 4.2 seconds for 7% improvement as well. Rounding out the top five we had **Vicki Fanucchi** trim 4.1 seconds for a 7% improvement as well.




<u>Consistency:</u> One of fun measures is who's the most consistent. This takes your three best runs of the day




and determines a standard deviation for those runs. Standard deviation is an indication of the variance from the mean value of your best three runs. The lower the value, the more consistent your runs were. Ron Aquilla best three runs varied by a mere 0.151 seconds. Greg Darrah close behind with a difference of 0.260 and Robert Laliberte 0.280 second difference.

Coneage: During the day an



intrepid group of course workers put cones back when they were displaced, knocked over and in some cases simply mowed down!!!! They corrected a total of 32 cones during the day (FYI - last year's class count was 31 cones). Not a bad day for the cones... to be honest they were a bit nervous going into this with all of the new autocrossers (yes cones can be afraid). Unfortunately there were a few cones that will not be returned to service and will be released to retirement. Please remember to thank the cones for their tireless service during your next course walk and apologize in advance to the ones you know you'll probably mow over. A total of 16 of the drivers today were responsible for the coneage. The remaining 11 while kind to the cones, did not do their part to keep



the course workers busy... please... push harder, driver faster next time, the course workers need to work harder. I would like to call out the work of our top cone squasher Albert Dennis who topped the charts by a good margin with 9 cones. He hit 4 on the first run, with a clean 2nd run and then 3 cones and 2 more in his final runs of the day. Honorable mention goes to the next two cone

squashers **Matt Petrali**, and **Ryan Fleming** who had three each during the day.





Golden Gate Region opened its DE season in conjunction with the opening round of the PCA Club Race, West Coast series at Thunderhill Raceway on March 23-24th. There

in about 2 years and the first time that I have attended a PCA Club Race. The event was very well organized with

dozens of volunteers needed to put the event on without issues. Golden Gate Region DE chair **Jim McClelland** showcased his skills organizing a flawless event not only for the PCA members participating in the DE event but did a great job coordinating the PCA Club Race. Safety is always a top concern whether in club racing or running a DE event and at the drivers meeting it was emphasized repeatedly.

The West Coast Series is a PCA club racing points competition comprised of the all the PCA club races that occur on the west coast of the USA. Historically,

club racing in the PCA has been most popular on the east coast, and this series was created (starting with the 2014 season) to encourage west coast club members to take up club racing by providing them with the increased competition and sense of camaraderie

that comes with having one's own competitive series. All PCA club racers are eligible to participate and all entrants are automatically entered into the series.



DE or Drivers Education Events are commonly run in conjunction with the PCA Race Series as a way to encourage more PCA members to get involved in a track experience and to learn the amazing performance capabilities of their Porsche. Adding a DE to the Club



Race also helps financially with covering the costs of the track rental. DE's are designed for members who are first time owners who have never driven in a track environment or drivers with years of track experience. GGR requires all first timers to attend a mandatory ground school usually held a week before the event as well as another orientation at the track. Included in your fees is an experienced instructor who will ride and coach you all day long until he or she feels you have the necessary basic skills to drive the track solo. Each DE event includes from 5-6 25 minute sessions on the track. Run groups are organized so that novices or beginners run in a separate group from the faster intermediate and advanced drivers. Between runs, beginners are required to attend post session debriefings which cover safety issues, the best lines for taking various turns at the track, a review of course worker locations on the track, what to do if you go off course, and other safety procedures. I was lucky to have as my instructor, **Stephen Shaw,** who assisted me in the

morning runs with my steering inputs, hand position, and the racing line. His 19 year old son, **Matt Shaw**, was also in attendance as a student and lapped me at least once in his Volkswagen GTI. Youth has its advantages!

Jim McClelland could not put on these events without the assistance of an experienced team of volunteers which include but is not limited to the following individuals: David Bunch, Sharon Neidel, George Neidel, Chuck Kolstad, Ken Mack, Scott Kalkin, Dan Thompson, Diane Dorr and Rick Schoonover. Thank you and all the volunteer driving instructors for your service to GGR and PCA!






