

#### **Traffic Gridlock!**



# M\_AX Fun By John Leet

We have now completed the first two SVR autocross events. Our second event was held in Stockton on May 25<sup>th</sup>. We had nice weather with mild temperatures and a slight breeze that kept things very comfortable. There was a strong showing for our second event with 58 drivers and quite a few joining us from other regions. Many drivers requested instruction, so our coaches (free of charge) were quite busy.

Setup went smoothly, thanks to the many Autocross team members and other volunteers that showed up around 7AM to ensure that everything got off to a good start. We enjoyed yet another challenging course, titled "Easy Until It's Not" designed by our SVR "evil genius" **Kent Treiber**. Genius for the great courses, evil for the turn


at the end of the straight near station four. There was a good mix of items that required drivers to combine the transitions well so you were lined up for the next one... miscalculations lead to slower times.

Top time of day changed hands a number of times during the day. We only had four people break into the 34 second or lower range during the day. Derek Hui was the first to dip into the sub 35's with a time of 34.657 with both Lanny Bowden dipping in at 34.782 and Himanshu Patel 34.997 hot on his heels. Derek held the top spot and then pulled went a bit faster on his 7th run with a time of 34.480. Feri Dizon tied together a great run, also dipping

in to the 34's on his final run but was a bit shy of the top spot with a time of 34.756. As the last car crossed the line for the day, Derek was still holding the top spot.

For the **ladies top time** we had a first run time and target set by **Meg Conkling** of 39.692. **Joy Nieslony** took the lead on her second run with a time of 38.195. Meg countered with a second run time of 37.845 and shaved a bit off each run through run four where she tied together her best run of the day with a time of 37.076. That would hold until the 9<sup>th</sup> and final run when Joy turned off the PSM for another run and showed the car that it was holding her back and snatched the top spot with a time of 37.001.

**Next up**, our third autocross event will be held on June 29th, which will be a Zone 7 event. For those of you who are new to PCA autocross, in addition to the autocross series that are run in each of the regions, some events are part of the prestigious Zone series, where drivers compete against drivers in all regions in Zone 7 within their respective class. For those competing in the Zone series, drivers must compete in at least 50% of the scheduled events and attend events in at least 3 regions to qualify for year end awards. The 2019 schedule has a total of 8 Zone events, so competitors will need to compete in at least 5 Zone events to qualify. The SVR June event will be the fourth Zone event. So, while this will likely have been concluded by the time of this publication, the latest results for the Zone series can be found on the Zone website at zone7.pca.org.



#### Brian Redman and the Lola T600, Pt 2

The developer of ground-effect aerodynamics was an engineer named Dr. Max Sardou who was associated with the famous SERA Eiffel wind tunnel. Sardou's theory started with

inducting air from under the nose of the car and from the natural low-pressure area behind the front tires and compressing it to exit out the rear of the car. In 1980, Sardou was one of the few people who knew anything



about venturi tunnels on either side of the chassis. Tunnels whose active surfaces were shaped like an inverted airfoil then vented the air out the back through tall voids. Variously called "diffuser tunnels," "air extractors," and "expansion cones," at the rear these tunnels took up all the space between the inner tire and transaxle on each side of the monocoque. The driveshafts simply passed through the expansion area.

Broadley's T600 GTP design followed Sardou's theory with venturi tunnels running on either side of the monocoque out the back through diffuser tunnels creating two large lowpressure areas between the car and the track causing the car to be "sucked down" to the track with tremendous force, gluing it to the road and allowing multiple-g lateral loads resulting in higher cornering speeds. Ground Effect Technology provides tremendous downforce without the "drag" of rear mounted wings, wicker bills and front body spoilers allowing higher over-all speeds. The Lola T600 GTP was one of the first sports cars to use ground

effects as the base for a design.

Redman and Hass agreed that the Lola T600 with its design based upon aerodynamicist Max Sardou's "Ground Effect Technology" would be a game changer in the new IMSA Prototype

Class. Broadley stated he would need two cars to be ordered to make the project profitable at a cost of \$80,000/ car. Hass then told Redman he would have to locate somebody to buy the first two chassis and he would share the

profits on the sale of future orders.

For the first order for the LolaT600 Redman had to look no further than

Cooke-Woods Racing which was already sponsoring the Garretson Enterprise 935 K3 for the Daytona 24 Hour event with Redman co-driving with Bobby Rahal and Bob Garretson. Redman approached Ralph Kent Cooke and Roy Woods to purchase one of the Lola T600 GTP cars to be powered by a small block Chevy motor to compete in the new

1981 IMSA Prototype series. Cooke – Woods racing agreed to purchasing s/n HU1 and the Lola T600 GTP was born. Brian Redman would be the Driver/manager.

After finalizing the purchase of the first T600 s/n HU1 to run in the IMSA series driven by Redman, Bob Garretson then proposed to Ralph Kent Cooke and Roy Woods that Cooke -Woods Racing purchase the second Lola T600 GTP HU2 chassis with the goal of installing a Porsche 936 3.2L Turbo motor and running the car in the June 13/14 Le Mans event. The Garretson team had huge successes in both Europe and the US from 1978 - 1980, running a Porsche 935 K3 with the 935 3.2L Turbo motor. Garretson Enterprises would already be at Le Mans running the Cook-Woods Racing 935 K3 co-driven by Anne Charlotte, a driver with a history of running at Le mans and other European circuits. Ralph Kent Cooke and Bob Garretson would complete the driving team. Note – having a French co-driver was a great help in working through the myriad of Le Mans' rules technical issues. But most importantly, being able

to converse in French with the Le Mans French officialdom. In addition, volunteers from the Golden Gate Region of PCA would be part of Garretson's Le Mans crew. In February

1981 Ralph Kent Cooke agreed to Garretson's offer and purchased Lola T600 chassis HU2 for \$80,000. Now the purchase of the second T600 that Broadley's contract required was finalized.

In the Fall of 1980 Broadley started work with Dr. Max Sardou to design the





ground effects underbody for the Lola. Broadley penned a very low body with long front and rear overhangs. One of Sardou's suggestions was removable wheel covers over the rear wheels to further control the air flowing through the venturi tunnels. Broadley and Andrew Thorby, who joined Lola in 1977 as a designer, built a quarterscale model based on Sardou's ideas and Broadley's design. They tested the model in the small rolling-road wind tunnel at Britain's Imperial College of Engineering. Broadley made many detail modifications to Sardou's design, though the overall shape, top and bottom, was pretty much as delivered by the consultant.

The Lola T600 s/n HU1 would be ready by the spring of 1981. The chassis would be a Honeycomb composite Aluminum monocoque to provide strength so the chassis would not flex from the great tremendous downforce generated. Front and rear tubularsteel subframes and semi-stressed powerplant completed the design. The front suspension was typical of the era's racing cars with upper and lower wishbones fabricated from steel tubing and a coil-over spring/shock unit. The small block chevy motor and a Hewland transaxle were located in the center between the diffuser tunnels. 13-inch Dunlop vented discs, BBS-style center lock alloys, and Goodyear racing tires on all four corners completed the running gear.

Redman hired as the second employee an English mechanic named John Bright, who was then working as a restorer at the Donington Museum and was, as Brian Redman insists, "Just a wizard fabricator."
The Cooke Woods team decided to operate out of the Mountain View, California shops of Garretson Enterprises.

Bright joined Redman at the Garretson's Mountain View shop. In those days it was fairly common practice at small British specialty firms to have a race team's mechanic help fabricate

the car at the factory, on the theory that it would give him better knowledge of the machine later on. No sooner did Bright arrive in Mountain View, then he returned to England and Brandley's Lola shops to assist in building the first T600 as an educational experience. (That he'd also just picked up a skilled hand on

the cheap couldn't have been lost on Broadley)

The first Lola
T600 GTP arrived
at Garretson
Enterprises in
April. The first four
IMSA events had
already been run.
The Garretson
team lead by Bright
installed the small
block Chevy motor
and completed the
assembly of the Lola
T600 s/n HU1. After
testing the T600 at

Sears Point Raceway, the Cooke-Woods Lola T600 GTP Chevy was ready for its first race. John Bright had been over every inch of the car, and Brian Redman had set it up to his liking. Stated Redman "This is the best prepared and designed new car that I have ever driven, and I have driven a lot of new or experimental cars in my 20-odd years in the business."

The T600's first race was the '81 May 3-4 IMSA race at Laguna Seca against a field of Porsche 935s, which included Rahal's Cooke-Woods Racing 935 K3.

I was fortunate to be in the

Garretson Enterprise pit on Saturday and Sunday when Redman qualified the Cook-Woods Racing Lola T600/Chevy GTP in 5<sup>th</sup> against the Porsche 935s. The Cooke-Woods 935 K3 driven by Bobby Rahal qualified 4<sup>th</sup>. His car was prepared by volunteer members of the Golden Gate Region of PCA

The Saturday evening before the race Carl Hass told Brian if the Lola T600 GTP Chevy didn't win on Sunday, Lola would go bankrupt. Eric Broadley who had traveled to Laguna Seca for the race was depending on Brian driving the Lola T600 GTP to victory in its maiden race. A win at Laguna would open the doors for additional orders for the T600 GTP so Broadley could keep the company's doors open. A win at Laguna on Sunday was crucial.


As Brian tells the story 'He didn't sleep all night'. Although Brian qualified

the Lola T600 GTP only 5<sup>th</sup> he could run at that speed the entire race, while the Porsche 935s would have to dial down their Turbo's boost to conserve fuel and finish the race.

Brian started the race and immediately worked his way to 1st. After several laps, he was going into turn 2 and the Lola developed a severe handling problem. He dropped back through the field to 10th place. At that

time turn 2 of the old Laguna Seca track was a high-speed left-hand curve with a high dirt wall on the outside of the turn. Turn 2 could be taken flat if the car was capable and the driver courageous

After several laps the T600 GTP's handling problem miraculously solved itself. Redman, with renewed confidence, worked his way up through the field. On lap 45 of 53 Brian caught up with the race leader John Paul Jr. who was driving a Porsche 935 K3. Several laps later he passed John Paul Jr. to win the race.
