The magazine is supported by our advertisers and their tremendous support helps to make the Drifter what it is. You can use the Drifter to find Porsche experts in our Region to repair, protect and enhance the performance of your vehicle.

Our current editor Matt Menning has worked for two years as our Editor Chair and is retiring at the end of this year. That means we need a replacement to step up and volunteer for this position. Red Rover Red Rover!

What does our region and a Range Rover have in common? Well, I for one just realized the answer is SVR. Land Rover has a super high performance version of their Range Rover. They call it the Sport SVR. It seems that \$118k gives you 575 supercharged hp and its targeting part of the Macan Turbo market. With two less cylinders the Macan makes 434hp via a twin turbo system. They both have an advertised 0 to 60 time of 4.3 seconds, yet the Macan has 141 les HP with a lower sticker price near \$86K. So, you get to have a Porsche in the garage and save about \$32k. Very interesting and Porsche for the win!

Porsche vs Tesla

On the cover of this month's issue is Porsche's 2020 Taycan Turbo. If you haven't heard, Porsche and Tesla have been seriously slugging it out on the Nürburgring. In late August, Porsche broke an EV record (they invented) with a production Taycan completing the Nordschleife course in 7:42 minutes. That is fast. From what I have learned, that's only 2 seconds slower than a 997 GT3. Tesla's Elon Musk went into full battle made and dispatched highly modified prototype Model S "Plaid" to

the track without reserving exclusive track time. Therefore, the track was busy at times and slight congestion ensued. At one point, the super Tesla broke down and the Porsche Taycan was filmed passing the Model S twice while it was being loaded up on a flatbed tow truck. Sadly the Taycan didn't toot the horn while driving past the scene. Elon Musk was highly embarrassed.

While all this was going on, Musk had been busily securing a location at the track to install one of his famed "Supercharger" stations to plug in at. Reports are that a diesel generator was seen powering the Tesla unit since a dedicated power line from the local grid was impossible on such short notice. (Cue the irony) Musk later tweeted to Porsche, mocking their "Turbo" badge on the Taycan, questioning the logic behind the chosen designation on the all-electric Taycan.

On September 17th, Tesla eventually broke Porsche's record by 20 seconds using their ultra-modified, 3 motor Model S. It appears that Tesla has poked the big bear and the bear isn't pleased! The Taycan Turbo S remains unofficially raced at the track. It has an over-boost mode so stay tuned for more to come!

The temperature was not as bad as expected and while approaching 100, a light breeze kept things reasonable. Setup of the course was primarily accomplished on Friday by some intrepid individuals that were able to access the course on Friday night. Thank you John, Martin, and Weyland. This allowed the work on Saturday to focus on finalization rather than setup.

Attendance was a little lighter than usual but for the 31 drivers that made it, we were treated to a 60 second course and managed to fit in a total of

10 runs. We continue to see new drivers at our events and look forward to seeing again. If you are one of the drivers attending your first few events, PLEASE reach out to us and let us know what we did well and of course how can help make your experience even better for next time. We look forward to your input (autocross@svr-pca. org)

to hit the braking points as well as work the cars into position to allow drivers to get to the gas quickly and smoothly accelerating to the next corner, and then finish off with a tight right and quick left turn across the finish line. Some drivers were better at the first loop and other at the latter. They key was to tie successes in the smooth speed carrying portion into equal success at braking appropriately, and setting the car up appropriately for the exits from the corners. The hard part was doing both successfully in the same run.

of the drivers capture their best time in the afternoon with a mere 13% garnering their fastest time on the final run of the day.


Men's Top Time:

Top time traded places a number of times during the day and was very close with the top four drivers. Himanshu Patel set the bar with a time of a first clean run of 58.182. Grady Carter came out quickly and posted a time of 57.992 to push Himanshu down in the standings. Grady followed up on

his third run with a 57.814 but the competition was not sitting idly. The nearly 34 second gap Grady initially enjoyed was now sitting below ½ a second with four drivers in the hunt for that top spot as of the sixth and final run. Coming out with a cool set of tires on the 7th run **Carl** Winkler tied the turns together and Posted a time of 57.357 pushing

Grady down a spot. Carl followed his 7th up with an even faster 57.282. Even though the gaps narrowed, Carl's time held through the 10th and final run.

PAX (Performance Adjustment Index) is an adjusted top time based on assigned handicaps based on vehicle make/model/year and level of modification and handicaps are based on actual performance of cars in multiple PCA AX events over the years. The adjustment allows for comparison of times on a more even playing field. Top 5 PAX times



significantly larger surface area afforded at Thunderhill Raceway. The course had a good mix of speed and timing that was split into two larger loops. The first loop started off with nice start and a left turn into a slalom, then looped back around to the slalom again. This first half of the course rewarded smooth inputs and the ability to carry speed

Drivers then transitioned to slightly smaller loops that rewarded the ability


appropriately around the course.

Average Times:

Average run times dropped by just over three seconds right off the bat and for the most part continued decreased through the day.

Top Times of Day:

We had an unusual occurrence in this event. We had over 52% of our drivers get their top time in the morning. Usually it's only about 40%. The rest



Thanks again to Tom and Kathy Sonsone for hosting, **Kim Nelson** for leading the event and the bands for the rockin' music.






















Tourmeister Gary Griffiths laid out a 150 mile route that we would enthusiastically tour into the afternoon.

And we were back to the "classic" tour, after road conditions the past two years made part of the preferred route impassable. Kicking off in Rocklin suburbia, soon the two groups of cars made their way through Auburn, to Foresthill, along Mosquito Ridge Road, past French Meadows Reservoir, up to Ice House, and finally wound our way down into Placerville. Though there were rest stops along the way, the group was ready for an excellent lunch at The Independent.

The modern Porsches (all models of the sports cars and a Macan) were represented, along with three of us in what Porsche is now calling "Classic"—2 993s (Turbo and 4S,

and 40 year old 930 Turbo. I remember when those 930s were new on the



showroom, and no car ever made was going to be faster.

No event recap would be complete without a mention of the members. Newly joined, to nearly a half century, and everything in between. Always interesting to get better acquainted, and find out how the journey to Porsche and PCA occurred. And at every turn during the rest stops, or finally at lunch, there was a new story to hear. The PCA motto of "it's not the cars, it's the people" in action.

Beyond that, the topic of conversation centered on "when is the next one?" Well, pretty much all that's required is taking the initiative. I've put on many, during my time in Arizona in the '80s, but no prior experience required. 2020 calendar setting date in early January will be here before we know it.

Thanks again to Gary for taking the time, and making the effort, to put on the tour. We'll see everyone again next year!












